Dear Saints in Christ,

As we approach the 50th anniversary of the walkout of Concordia Seminary in St. Louis on February 19, 1974, I would like to take this time to reflect on some of the issues that are important to understand. Over the next couple of months will be a series addressing some of the issues which were occurring throughout Synod at the time. These will come by way of a theological abstract (a fancy word for summary). These were written for a historical theology class in the Doctor of Ministry Program at Concordia Theological Seminary. The next in the series is Gospel and Scripture.

Gospel and Scripture

Why should people believe in the Bible? Why do they believe in the Bible? The faculty and staff of Concordia Seminary wrestled with these questions throughout the middle quarter of the 20th century. Synodical president JAO (Jack) Preus and the faculty of Concordia Seminary agreed that this issue, the one of Gospel and Scripture was at the core of the brewing controversy at the seminary. As with any historical event these issues did not begin in St. Louis in 1974. Rather, an adoption of the teachings of Barth, Elert, and other theologians at Bad Boll had laid the foundation for the controversy which would follow.

The issue with the faculty, however, is that they were teaching directly against Scripture itself and Symbolical Books of the Lutheran Church. Scripture itself is the standard for Gospel proclamation as St. Paul lays out in 1 Corinthians 15.3-4 and as witnessed by Paul himself as he stayed in Berea (Acts 17.11). The Gospel is the object of our faith, however, faith also believes the full council of God as revealed in Scripture. In accordance with Scripture and the Lutheran Confessions it is believed, taught and confessed that Law and Gospel do something in the life of the sinner.

This was not, however, what the faculty majority at Concordia Seminary was teaching. Many of the faculty and staff had adapted a stance of "Gospel Reductionism," meaning that the "Gospel" gave the Scriptures their normative character, not vice-versa. This was stated in the document produced by the faculty entitled: *Faithful to Our Calling, Faithful to Our Lord: An Affirmation in Two Parts.* This is to utterly conflate the understanding of Scripture and the Gospel. They treated the Gospel as something which hovered over top of the text and if anything was in disagreement with the Gospel it was not seen as good or profitable. In *A Statement of Scriptural and Confessional Principals* this particular issue is addressed in section IV.C. Particularly relevant is the last antithesis: "That Christians need not accept matters taught in the Scriptures that are not a part of the 'Gospel." This particular point was one which caused much consternation and debate amongst the faculty who found it particularly to be a problem. At the 1973 convention in New Orleans the faculty majority position was condemned in part because of their teaching of Gospel reductionism.

Who determines the content of theology: an inspired and inerrant Scripture which stands above the reader, or the thoughts and piety of the reader who is to determine and accept what the "Word of God is for them?" It is not the individual, or the church for that matter, who serves as the guarantor for the Gospel or as its protector. To answer the question posed at the beginning: People should believe the Bible because it is God's Word; people do believe the Bible because of the Good News that it brings to them.

The Elders

Like the Deacons, the Elders are one of the three original church offices listed in the St. Peter constitution. The Deacons position was described in an earlier newsletter and it was felt that being a deacon is a good position to have for someone new to holding a church office.

Unlike the Deacons, the position of Elder is reserved for someone who is familiar with the Lutheran Church, and preferably familiar with our St. Peter congregation. In all likelihood, an Elder has held other church offices and brings experience to this position. According to our church constitution, the Elders are guided by Matthew 18:15-18, which reads: "if your brother sins against you, go and show him his fault, just between the two of you. If he listens to you, you have won your brother over. But if he will not listen, take one or two others along, so that 'every matter may be established by the testimony of two or three witnesses'. If he refuses to listen to them, tell it to the church; and if he refuses to listen even to the church, treat him as you would a pagan or a tax collector. "I tell you the truth, whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven."

The four Elders at our St. Peter church are Rod Busick (Head), John Fuelling, Jim Fuelling, and Andy Wolf. Two Elders are elected each year for a two year term and they meet one time per month. According to the constitution, their duties are as follows:

- 1. Assist Pastor in all matters pertaining to the spiritual welfare of the congregation.
- 2. Consider complaints and grievances of members of the congregation. If Matthew 18:15-16 has been fully observed, and they shall report to the congregation those who cannot be otherwise adjusted, in accordance with Matthew 18:17-18.
- 3. Make every effort to induce members who have been negligent in their attendance of divine services, in the use of Sacraments, and in the financial and privileges of their membership.
- 4. See to it that the Divine Services are conducted in such a manner as to avoid needless disturbance, and to foster an attitude conducive to worship of the Holy Trinity among those in attendance.
- 5. Assist the Pastor in arranging for pulpit assistance, special services, guest attendance; or paying seminary student field workers (as long as the congregation is involved in the program); or paying guest seminary students who may substitute for the Pastor.
- 6. The outgoing Head Elder shall be part of the annual Nominating Committee.
- 7. The Elders shall prepare a list of candidates when the congregation is to call a Pastor, which includes receiving and using ideas from the congregation.
- 8. They shall be an example of Christian conduct and conversation, particularly in their involvement in regular worship, reception of the Lord's Supper, and study the Word of God.

In order to accomplish the duties listed above, the Elders must work very closely with the Pastor. They stated that by discussing many church issues, they are able to understand the Pastor's point of view, and can explain it to a church member, should a question arise. It should be noted that the Elders do want members to approach them with any questions that they might have about the services and/or business of the St. Peter congregation. They feel that it is their responsibility to answer questions, and will do so without judgement, and without identifying the person with the concerns.

Thank you to all of our Elders, past and present, who serve to ensure that the needs of our St. Peter congregation are met according to the constitution.
