#### **Trustees**

In a previous issue of the newsletter, we mentioned that the three original church offices were deacons, elders, and trustees. We have covered the first two offices, and in this issue, we will cover the Trustees office. Each year, the Voter's Assembly elects two trustees to serve a two-year term. At any given time, we have four trustees to cover the needs of the church, plus one trustee to handle the needs of St. Peter Immanuel Lutheran School. Currently, Sam Braun and Barry Scherer are fulfilling their second year of a two-year term as Trustee, and Vern Witte and Greg Fuelling have begun their first year as Trustee. Ben Franz is our trustee to SPI, and he shares that responsibility with a person elected from Immanuel, so that the school also has two trustees. Currently, Ben is working with Ralph Thieme from Immanuel. Although we are describing these positions by first and second year of a term, please don't think that these men are new to their jobs. Sam became a trustee for the first time in 1985. Barry said that he took his first church office right after high school, around 1980 – 82. Vern was a trustee for the first time in 1969, and Greg isn't sure which year he started, but he has always shared the office with Vern. Ben has been our Trustee at SPI for ten years and plans to continue in that position for many more.

You may ask, what would make a person accept this church office so many times? The answer from all five of them was the same----they love fixing things. The church trustees are responsible for the outside of the church building (deacons are responsible for the inside of the church); and for other church property which includes both parsonages and the adjoining yards. All four church trustees stated that they treat these properties as if they were their homes. They do not hold regular meetings. It is also possible to go several months without being asked to work on a specific project. Yet, they do keep track of the condition of the roof, parking lot lights, the stability of electrical poles on the property, locks, etc. They all also stated that they never feel that they need to work alone. There is always another trustee (or three) to ask questions of and help with a project. Since St. Peter congregation is blessed with people who are generous with their time and talents, they each felt that there is a long list of people that they can call on when additional help is needed. According to the constitution, "The Trustees shall be the legal representatives of the congregation. They shall protect the property of the congregation from loss or damage and shall keep it in good condition and repair. For the purpose of needed repairs and immediate necessity, the Trustees shall have the power to draw from the Treasury the amount needed. They are not to undertake new improvement without authority from the Voter's Assembly." In regards to being the legal representatives of the congregation, an example would be if the church needed to take out a loan, the Head Trustee would sign for the loan on behalf of the church. In regards to the school trustee, their job description is more detailed, but the responsibilities are essentially the same. The school trustee works closely with the trustee from Immanuel. They work with the SPI Board and the principal to take care of school-related matters. There is a joint SPI account to use for small expenditures. Each congregation puts \$2500 into the account annually. This usually meets the needs. There is also money available from the Lehrman Estate and from the Switzer Estate. The school trustees hire the custodian and the groundskeeper for SPI and those two people report to the Trustees. As part of their job, the school trustees are responsible for rental use and the lending of school property and equipment. They also review the insurance policy to be sure that SPI has adequate coverage.

All five of St. Peter's trustees feel that the church office of trustee is a good entry level position. They feel that anyone interested in it should enjoy fixing things and working outside, knowing that they will receive plenty of help when needed. It helps to be mechanically inclined. Some of their projects in the past have included: pouring cemetery runners, cemetery maintenance such as adding dirt to graves when they have settled, moving pinecones, removing trees along the church, planting new trees, cleaning gutters, pest control, etc. And for those who have been here for several years, a favorite project to be part of was the building of the new school. For the many years that each of these men have served St. Peter congregation as a trustee, they have many interesting stories to tell. I would like to thank them for taking their time for this interview as they provided insight to this church office. Thank you for all that you have done for our St. Peter Lutheran Church, and St. Peter Immanuel Lutheran School.
